After writing about diamonds, I wanted the second book in the series to focus on rubies. I quickly learned that one of the world's most famous jewels – The Black Prince's Ruby – had a long, bloody history. Bright red and two inches long, the gemstone's odyssey began in the Moorish Kingdom of Granada, continued into the Battle of Agincourt atop Henry V's crown and ended as the centerpiece of Britain's Imperial State Crown. The happy ending is tarnished by one thing: The Black Prince's Ruby is not a ruby at all. It is a natural red spinel.

Travel across the Atlantic Ocean to the Chesapeake Bay where Blackbeard stalked unsuspecting merchant ships, leaving the water as red as a ruby. Before being caught and hanged, the pirate and his crew plundered dozens of ships and hid the spoils beneath tree roots.

Rubies, pirates and buried treasure? Sounds like the foundation for a mystery!



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
